**ANAESTHESIA IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES
ONE DAY PRIMER COURSE**

The aim of the one-day course is to outline the basics of anaesthetic practice in the Developing World, and to provide an introduction for those who plan to attend our main course, which this year will be held in Uganda in November.

The July one-day programme will include lectures and a choice of seminars:

- Introduction to working in the Developing World
- Theory and practical work with draw-over apparatus
- Equipment maintenance and servicing
- Drug supplies in the developing world
- Theory and practice of Oxygen Concentrators
- Patients and procedures in the developing world – how are they different?
- Experiences overseas/ Anaesthesia in Uganda
- Primary Trauma Care

The course fee will be £120 (including refreshments and light lunch). Participants who attend the Oxford course will qualify for reduced registration rates for the full Uganda course.

The international five-day course (see separate flyer) comprehensively covers the needs of those with an interest in working in the developing world, and also those involved in planning for military and disaster situations. It consists of a variety of lectures, seminars, hospital visits and technical demonstrations.
